The famous Arlberg region of the Austrian Alps offers 160 miles of prepared runs, 110 miles of off-piste (ungroomed) runs, 85 lifts and 4,900 feet of vertical drop, all on the same lift pass! *St. Anton* will be our base for the week, the most well-known resort in the region. From there, we can easily ski the nearby resorts of St. Christoph, Zürs, Lech and Stuben. Some of the best, wide-open, groomed runs in Europe await us. Begin your day in St. Anton, ski to *St. Christoph* for lunch, schuss down to *Stuben* in the afternoon, and still make it back to St. Anton in time for dinner. Or take the bus to *Lech* and ski over to *Zürs*, a picturesque village with a history dating back to the 12th century. Each day, you will find something different to do and see, both on and off the slopes. For après-ski fun, make sure you ski to the Mooserwirt or Krazy Kangaruh, located on the slopes above St. Anton. Every afternoon, skiers pack in to these bars until they are so crowded that the only place to dance is on the tables! The nightlife is especially lively with many bars and discos staying open until the wee hours of the morning. If you want to do some sightseeing, the train station in St. Anton makes it easy to take day trips to cities like Innsbruck and Salzburg.

The charming, 3-star *Hotel Edelweiss* will be our home for the week. The Schöpf family has run the hotel for years, and they look forward to welcoming us and ensuring that we enjoy our stay. It is ideally located on a quiet street just past the old church - a couple of blocks to the pedestrian area and only a five minute walk to the main lift station. The hotel features a sauna, steam room and solarium. An extensive buffet breakfast and multi-course dinner is served in the cozy restaurant. All guest rooms are comfortably furnished and contain private bathroom, direct dial telephone, radio and TV.

TOUR DETAILS AND CONDITIONS

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENTS

A deposit of \$300 per person is due to hold your place on this tour. Upon receipt of payment, you will be sent an invoice and "Know Before You Go" information kit. Final payment is **December 1, 2000**. Your space may be cancelled if payments are not received on time.

PRICING

This package is based on a minimum group size of 20 participants. Should the group size fall between 15 and 19 people, the package price will increase by \$25 per person to cover increased transfer costs. Package price is subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluations, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of May 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. In case of human or computer billing error, All Mountain Vacations reserves the right to reinvoice for the correct amount. *All prices reflect a cash or check discount.* For further payments by Visa, MasterCard or American Express, add 3%.

Land Only: \$1124 per person, double occupancy.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENT

Single rooms are very limited and may be available for a surcharge of \$150.

EXCHANGE RATE INFORMATION

The U.S. dollar is currently enjoying an extremely favorable exchange rate with the European currencies and the Eurodollar. The pricing of this package reflects the strong value of the dollar. Forecasts indicate that the U.S. dollar will remain strong. However, in the event of a significant drop on the dollar's value, a surcharge will be applied to your package price.

DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Deviations and extensions are allowed. In addition to any airfare increases/fees and extra land charges, a deviation fee of \$75 will be charged by All Mountain Vacations. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation requests must be submitted prior to **November 20, 2000**. Once deviation itinerary has been confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any additional air and land costs.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations must be received in writing. Prior to Sep. 1: forfeit \$25 early sign-up payment. Sep. 1 - Nov. 30: forfeit \$300 per person, unless an acceptable replacement is found. Dec. 1 - departure: forfeit total land costs plus any airline charges. *Trip protection insurance is highly recommended.*

TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel worry-free with Travel Guard Cancellation and Interruption Insurance. For only \$157 per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package that includes the following benefits: full reimbursement of covered non-refundable payments; \$10,000 medical expense; \$20,000 emergency assistance; \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner's risk. It is up to passenger to make claims with the airline and insurance company. Insurance should be purchased with initial deposit for full value protection. PASSPORTS AND VISAS

U.S. and Canadian citizens require a valid passport. Non-citizens should consult their consulate.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Group space in Tourist Class has been booked on SAS from Seattle for this departure. Departures from other cities or connecting flights are available, usually at a carrier add-on surcharge. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own air arrangements. You are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group in order to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for details. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related reasons.

BAGGAGE

Normal baggage allowance is 2 pieces per person, not to exceed 70 lbs each. A skier on an international flight is allowed to substitute 1 ski bag and 1 boot bag for one of the suitcases, for a total of *three* pieces of checked luggage. In addition, 1 carry-on bag is allowed with a max. weight of 18 lbs. and max. dimensions of 20x16x10 in. Carry-on baggage must fit under seat or in overhead bin. Excess baggage fee may cost \$110 minimum each way per bag.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats are assigned on a first booked and request basis. Carriers will do their best to honor all requests. All SAS flights are non-smoking.

MILEAGE CREDIT

Mileage credit may be earned for your flights. You must be a member before checking in for the flight, and you must submit your mileage account number at check-in.

TOUR ESCORT

Tour is escorted but not necessarily on all flights. Your escort's primary concern is the welfare of the group. He will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of the group needs.

NOT INCLUDED

Meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff, or guides, items of a personal nature, and **Airport Taxes of approximately \$70 per person.**

TIPPING

It is customary to tip bus drivers and ski guides, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. Your tour escort will discuss details.
