Saint Gervais is the only resort in the Mont Blanc region of France that combines the pleasures of skiing and other snow activities with spa treatments at the local hot springs. The massive ski arena, Evasion Mont Blanc, includes five resorts, 121 ski lifts, 280 miles of downhill slopes and 5,400 feet of vertical drop. From perfectly groomed runs to challenging off-piste terrain, you'll find the snow you are seeking, whatever your ability level. Cross-country skiers have free access to all 17 miles of the Saint Gervais nordic ski circuit. Pedestrian lift passes are available for non-skiers, allowing access to several miles of high mountain footpaths, spectacular views of Mont Blanc, and many on-slope restaurants. Megève, France's most elegant and upscale resort, is just a couple of cable car rides away. Everyone will want to take a ride on the Tramway du Mont Blanc, one of only three remaining rack and pinion railways in France. A scenic ride takes pedestrians and skiers through forests and snow-covered pastures to the Bellevue/Les Houches plateau (5,905 ft.) at the foot of Mont Blanc.

After an invigorating day on the slopes, the best way to relax is with a visit to the hot springs at Le Fayet. Les Thermes de Saint Gervais, situated in a magnificent park setting below town, has been open for over 200 years and is prepared to treat you to the most advanced techniques in spa treatments. You are sure to be rejuvenated, whether you spend a little or a lot. One of the most popular treatments is the "After Skiing," consisting of a jet shower, a thermal underwater massage by a physiotherapist and free access to the sauna and steam baths. One "After Skiing" treatment is included in your package.

Saint Gervais has a lovely renovated town center with a good selection of restaurants, bars and shops. Just above Saint Gervais, at the first stop of the cable car is the small hamlet of Le Bettex, the birthplace of skiing in the region. Here you will find a charming restaurant, a ski school and several shops. Facing Mont Blanc, St. Nicolas de Véroce is a typical mountain village. Make sure you visit its' greatest treasure, a beautiful baroque church. Free resort shuttle buses operate throughout the region. Your home for the week will be the comfortable, 3-star Hotel Carlina, situated above the cable car station and about a 10 minute walk from the center. The hotel offers cozy guest rooms, a bar and restaurant with open fireplace, a billiards room, reading room, sauna and indoor swimming pool.

TOUR DETAILS AND CONDITIONS

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENTS

A deposit of \$300 per person is due to hold your place on this tour. Upon receipt of payment, you will be mailed an invoice and "Know Before You Go" information kit. Final payment is due **December 11, 2000**. Your place may be cancelled if payments are not received on time. *Trip cancellation insurance is strongly advised*

PRICING

The package price is based on a minimum group size of 20 participants. Should the group size fall between 15 and 19 people, package price will increase by \$75 per person. Should the group size fall between 10 and 14 people, the package price will increase by \$150 per person. If fewer than 10 people, the package price will remain the same, but the trip may not be escorted. Package prices are subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluations, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of May 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. *All prices reflect a cash or check discount.* For payments by Visa, Mastercard or American Express, add 3%.

Land only: \$1020 per person, double occupancy.

Non-skier reduction: Deduct \$75 from package price and receive a 6-day Pedestrian Lift Pass.

Spa treatment reduction: If you do not want the spa treatment, deduct \$40 from package price.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENT

Single rooms are very limited and available on request only. Add \$220 to package price. A typical single room in a European hotel is small and contains one twin bed.

EXCHANGE RATE INFORMATION

The U.S. dollar is currently enjoying an extremely favorable exchange rate with the European currencies and the Eurodollar. The pricing of this package reflects the strong value of the dollar. Forecasts indicate that the U.S. dollar will remain strong. However, in the event of a significant drop in the dollar's value, a surcharge will be applied to your package price.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Group space in Tourist Class has been booked on SAS from Seattle for this departure. Departures from other cities or connecting flights are available, usually at a carrier add-on surcharge. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own air arrangements. You are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group in order to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for details. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related reasons.

DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Deviations and extensions are allowed. In addition to any airfare increases/fees and extra land charges, a deviation fee of \$75 will be charged by All Mountain Vacations. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation and extension requests must be submitted prior to

December 1, 2000. Once deviation itinerary has been confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any additional air and land costs.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations must be received in writing. Cancellation fees of \$100 per person apply prior to Sep. 1, 2000, unless a replacement can be found. From Sep. 1 - Dec. 10, forfeit \$300 per person, unless a replacement can be found. If a replacement is found, forfeit only \$100. Total land costs plus any airline charges are forfeited from December 11 to departure. *Trip protection insurance is highly recommended.*

TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel worry-free with Travel Guard Cancellation and Interruption Insurance. For only \$112 per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package that includes the following benefits: full reimbursement of all non-refundable expenses due to cancellation for a medical reason; \$10,000 medical expense; \$20,000 emergency assistance; \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner's risk. It is up to the passenger to make claims with the insurance company. Insurance should be purchased with deposit or final invoice for full value protection. Please be sure that you are adequately covered in case of accident, injury or illness during the trip. **Pre-Existing Medical Conditions Exclusion waived, if policy purchased within 7 days of initial trip deposit.** *For complete coverage information, please ask for Travel Guard brochure.*

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

U.S. and Canadian citizens require a valid passport. Non-citizens should consult their consulate.

BAGGAGE

Normal baggage allowance is 2 pieces per person, not to exceed 70 lbs each. A skier on an international flight is allowed to substitute 1 ski bag and 1 boot bag for one of the suitcases, for a total of three pieces of checked luggage. In addition, 1 carry-on bag is allowed with a max. weight of 18 lbs. and max. dimensions of 20x16x10 in. Carry-on baggage must fit under seat or in overhead bin. Excess baggage fee may cost \$110 minimum each way per bag.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats are assigned on a first booked and request basis. Airlines will do their best to honor all requests.

CARTE NEIGE - FRENCH SKI INSURANCE

In addition to any other kinds of insurance you have, we suggest that you spend about \$2 a day for Carte Neige insurance. It can be purchased at the lift ticket office when you purchase your lift pass and it offers the ultimate in on-mountain coverage and protection. If you are injured on the slopes and need to be evacuated, all of the costs of search and rescue, transportation to the nearest medical facility, reimbursement of lift pass and medical expenses, civil liability against other skiers, breakage of skis and more are covered. If you do not hold Carte Neige, be prepared to pay, by credit card, for any services or treatments you require.

MILEAGE CREDIT

Mileage credit may be earned for your flights. You must be a member before checking in for the flight, and you must submit your mileage account number at check-in.

TOUR ESCORT

Tour is escorted but not necessarily on all flights. Your escort's primary concern is the welfare of the group. He will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of the group needs.

NOT INCLUDED

Meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff, or guides, items of a personal nature, and *airport taxes of approximately \$70 per person.*

TIPPING

If you have received good service, it is customary to tip bus drivers, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. Your tour escort will offer suggestions and discuss details.
