## Serre Chevalier

Our first week will be spent in **Briançon**, the largest of four towns that comprise the vast **Serre Chevalier** ski region. This massive winter sports arena boasts 72 ski lifts covering more than 150 miles of downhill slopes and nearly 5,300 feet of vertical drop. Our home will be the charming **Auberge Le Mont Prorel**, situated at the base of the Prorel gondola, gateway to the entire Serre Chevalier winter playground. This small, family-run hotel features well-appointed guest rooms, a cozy dining room, and a bar and lounge with piano. While in Briançon, we can visit the historical Old Town, a walled city with fort, castle and monastery dating back to the 1600s as well as numerous shops and restaurants lining narrow cobblestone streets. A day of skiing at nearby **La Grave** is a must. Thanks to the La Meije glacier, La Grave boasts Europe's largest natural, ungroomed, off-piste terrain. With over 6,700 feet of vertical, we'll find a well-blended mix of wide-open runs, steep couloirs and tree-skiing.

## Meribel

Our next destination is **Meribel**, a picturesque village nestled among the trees in the heart of the famous **Trois Vallees** ski region - considered to be the biggest ski area in the world. Imagine one lift pass encompassing five resorts including Courchevel, Meribel and Val Thorens; 200 modern interconnected lifts and over 320 miles of groomed runs! Non-skiers will find plenty to do - the Olympic Centre features an ice arena, pool, climbing wall, bowling alley, sauna, jacuzzi and steambath. Our hotel is the cozy **Hotel Le Merilys** situated above the village just a short walk from the slopes. For your relaxation, enjoy the hotel bar, salon with fireplace, billiards room, sauna and sundeck. A special feature of this tour is the hotel's unique dine-around program. Each night, we will dine in a different restaurant, including a snowshoe trek and a traditional meal in the old village after a tour of a 17th century church. Our last evening will be a gala event with a gastronomique meal at a nearby hotel.

## Paris

After two weeks of serious skiing, it is time for some serious sightseeing! We'll journey by motor coach and TGV train to **Paris** for a three night stay. The Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, Champs Elysees, l'Arc de Triomphe, Notre Dame, shops, cafes, fine dining and more await us.

#### DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENTS

A deposit of \$300 per person is due to confirm your place on this trip. A second deposit of \$1000 is due by **October 15, 2000**. Final payment must be paid by **December 20, 2000**. *Trip insurance is advised!*

#### PRICING

The package price is based on a minimum group size of 30 people participating in the entire tour. Should the group size for any part of the tour fall below 30 people, a surcharge may be imposed. Package price is subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluation, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of May 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. In case of human or computer billing error, we reserve the right to reinvoice for the correct amount. *All prices reflect a cash or check discount.* For payments by Visa, MasterCard or American Express, add 3%.

**Land Only: \$2600 per person, double occupancy.**

#### SINGLE SUPPLEMENT

Single rooms are limited and on request only. Add \$400 to the package price.

#### DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Deviations and extensions are allowed. In addition to any airfare increases/fees and extra land charges, a deviation fee of \$75 will be charged by All Mountain Vacations. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation and extension requests must be submitted prior to

**December 5, 2000**. Once deviation itinerary is confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any extra air/land costs.

#### CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations must be received in writing. Prior to **October 15, 2000**: forfeit \$300. **October 15 - December 19, 2000**: forfeit \$1300 unless an acceptable replacement is found. From **December 20** - departure: Forfeit full package price unless refunds can be negotiated with airline and land operators. *Trip protection insurance is highly recommended.*

#### TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

You can assure a worry-free trip by purchasing travel insurance. Ask for an application or one will be mailed to you in your “Know Before Your Go” kit. For only \$242 per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package from Travel Guard International that includes the following benefits: full refund of all *covered* non-refundable payments; \$10,000 medical expense; \$20,000 emergency assistance; \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner’s risk. It is up to the individual to make claims with the airline and insurance company. Insurance should be purchased with initial deposit for full value protection. Please be sure that you are adequately covered in case of accident, injury or illness during the trip. *For full coverage details, please consult the Travel Guard brochure.*

#### PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Every American **MUST** have a valid passport that does not expire during the tour, for travel abroad and re-entry into the United States. Visas are currently not required for travel to Western Europe. **It is your sole responsibility** to have in your possession at all times a valid passport.

#### BAGGAGE

Normal baggage allowance is 2 pieces per person, not to exceed 70 lbs each. A skier on an international flight is allowed to substitute 1 ski bag and 1 boot bag for one of the suitcases, for a total of **three** pieces of checked luggage. In addition, 1 carry-on bag is allowed with a max. weight of 18 lbs. and max. dimensions of 20x16x10 in. Carry-on baggage must fit under seat or in overhead bin. Excess baggage fee is \$110 minimum each way per bag.

#### AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Choose from SAS departures from Seattle, Chicago and New York. Should you wish to depart out of other cities, add-on or airfares on other carriers may be available. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own flights. Those who book their own flights are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for prices. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related purposes.

#### SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats are assigned on a first booked and request basis. The airlines will do their best to honor all requests. All flights are non-smoking.

#### MILEAGE CREDIT

You may earn mileage credit for your flight. You must be a member prior to checking in for your flight, and you must present your account number at check-in.

#### SKI PASSES

Lift passes are not included in price. A 6-day pass in Serre Chevalier costs approx. \$160. A 6-day pass in Meribel/Trois Valles costs approx. \$180. Daily tickets and passes of shorter duration are available. Photos are not required.

#### TOUR ESCORTS

The tour is escorted from Seattle, but not necessarily on all flights. Their responsibility is for the welfare of the group. They will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of the group needs.

#### NOT INCLUDED

Lift passes, meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff, or guides, items of a personal nature, and *Airport Taxes of approximately \$65 per person.*

#### TIPPING

It is customary to tip bus drivers and guides, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. Your tour escorts will discuss details.
