The famous Arlberg region of the Austrian Alps offers 160 miles of prepared runs, 110 miles of off-piste (ungroomed) runs, 85 lifts and 4,900 feet of vertical drop, all on the same lift pass! **St. Anton** will be our base for the week, the most well-known resort in the region. From there, we can easily ski the nearby resorts of St. Christoph, Zürs, Lech and Stuben. Some of the best, wide-open, groomed runs in Europe await us. Begin your day in St. Anton, ski to **St. Christoph** for lunch, schuss down to **Stuben** in the afternoon, and still make it back to St. Anton in time for dinner. Or take the bus to **Zürs** and ski over to **Lech**, a picturesque village with a history dating back to the 12th century. Each day, you will find something different to do and see, both on and off the slopes. For après-ski fun, make sure you ski to the Mooserwirt or Crazy Kanguruh, located on the slopes above St. Anton. Every afternoon, skiers pack into these bars until they are so crowded that the only place to dance is on the tables! The nightlife is especially lively with many bars and discos staying open until the wee hours of the morning. If you want to do some sightseeing, cities like Innsbruck and Salzburg are easily accessible by train.

The cozy, 4-star **Hotel Kertess** will be our home for the week. It is situated on a quieter street above the village and about a 10 minute walk from the main lift station and center of town. Free shuttle service to and from the lifts is provided. The hotel features a charming restaurant, bar and sitting area, and an indoor swimming pool and sauna.

TOUR DETAILS AND CONDITIONS

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENTS

A \$300 per person deposit is due to confirm your space on this tour. Upon receipt of payment, you will receive an invoice and "Know Before You Go" information kit. Final payment is due no later than **February 1, 2001**. Your space may be cancelled if payments are not received on time.

PRICING

This package is based on a minimum group size of 20 participants. Should the group size fall between 15 and 19 people, the package price will *increase by \$75 per person*. Package price is subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluations, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of May 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. In case of human or computer billing error, All Mountain Vacations reserves the right to reinvoice for the correct amount. *All prices reflect a cash or check discount.* For payments by Visa, MasterCard or American Express, add 3%.

Land Only: \$1050 per person, double occupancy.

Single supplement: Add \$175 to package price. Please note that European single rooms are typically quite small and contain one twin bed.

Triple room rate: Deduct \$55 per person, for three adults sharing a room.

Children's Prices: The package prices below are based on the children's ages and on one or two children sharing room with parents.

EXCHANGE RATE INFORMATION

The U.S. dollar is currently enjoying an extremely favorable exchange rate with the European currencies and the Eurodollar. The pricing of this package reflects the strong value of the dollar. Forecasts indicate that the U.S. dollar will remain strong. However, in the event of a significant drop on the dollar's value, a surcharge will be applied to your package price.

DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Several people in the group plan to extend their stay in Europe. Below are some ideas and prices. You are also welcome to make your own plans. All Mountain Vacations can assist you with any additional hotel, train or car reservations. After your deviation plans are confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any additional air and land costs. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation requests must be submitted prior to **January 23, 2001**.

Overnight in Copenhagen, Denmark on return.

\$75 per person, double occupancy. \$125 per person, single occupancy.

Ask for other room rates. Price includes 1 night lodging at a downtown, 3-star hotel; buffet breakfast and all local taxes. Transfers between airport and hotel are on your own. You will arrive in Copenhagen at 1:45 p.m. on Saturday, March 24 and depart at 3:35 p.m. on Sunday, March 25. Arrive in Seattle at 4:35 p.m. on Sunday, March 25.

Paris Extension

\$445 per person, double occupancy. \$595 per person, single occupancy.

Ask for other room rates. Price includes 2nd class rail ticket with seat reservations from Zurich to Paris; 3 nights lodging in a 3-star hotel; continental breakfast daily; and all local taxes. Transfers between rail station, hotel and airport are on your own. You will arrive in Paris at approx. 5:10 p.m. on Saturday, March 24. Depart Paris at 12:10 p.m. on Tuesday, March 27. Arrive in Seattle at 4:35 p.m. on the same day.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations must be received in writing. Prior to Sep. 1: forfeit \$50 per person. Sep. 1 - Jan. 31: forfeit \$250 per person, unless an acceptable replacement is found. If a replacement is found, forfeit \$50. Feb. 1 - departure: forfeit total land costs plus any airline charges. *Trip protection insurance is highly recommended.*

TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel worry-free with Travel Guard Cancellation and Interruption Insurance. For only \$157 per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package that includes the following benefits: full reimbursement of covered non-refundable payments if trip is cancelled due to medical reasons; \$10,000 medical expense; \$20,000 emergency assistance; \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner's risk. It is up to passenger to make claims with the airline and insurance company. Insurance should be purchased with initial deposit for full value protection. Please be sure that you are adequately covered in case of accident, injury or illness during the trip. PASSPORTS AND VISAS

U.S. and Canadian citizens require a valid passport. Non-citizens should consult their consulate.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Group space in Tourist Class has been booked on SAS from Seattle for this departure. Departures from other cities or connecting flights are available, usually at a carrier add-on surcharge. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own air arrangements. You are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group in order to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for details. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related reasons.

BAGGAGE

Normal baggage allowance is 2 pieces per person, not to exceed 70 lbs each. A skier on an international flight is allowed to substitute 1 ski bag and 1 boot bag for one of the suitcases, for a total of *three* pieces of checked luggage. In addition, 1 carry-on bag is allowed with a max. weight of 18 lbs. and max. dimensions of 20x16x10 in. Carry-on baggage must fit under seat or in overhead bin. Excess baggage fee may cost \$110 minimum each way per bag.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats are assigned on a first booked and request basis. Airlines will do their best to honor all requests. All flights are non-smoking.

MILEAGE CREDIT

If traveling on SAS, earn mileage credit with United Airlines Mileage plus or the SAS EuroBonus program by submitting account number when you check in for your first flight. You must be a member prior to departure. If traveling on another carrier, ask for mileage partner information.

TOUR ESCORT

Tour is escorted from Seattle but not necessarily on all flights. Your escorts' primary concern is the welfare of the group. They will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of the group needs.

NOT INCLUDED

Lift tickets, meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff, or guides, items of a personal nature, and *airport taxes of approximately \$70 per person.*

TIPPING

If you have received good service, it is customary to tip bus drivers and ski guides, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. Your tour escort will discuss details.
