Please join our lively and friendly group on another memorable European adventure!

Our destination this year is world-renowned **Chamonix**, situated at the crossroads of France, Switzerland and Italy. The Chamonix Valley is comprised of five ski areas, 62 lifts and a dozen charming villages. The most spectacular sight is Mont Blanc, Europe's highest peak at 15,770 feet. At night, the light of the Aiguille du Midi lift station looks like a star shining in the sky! You're sure to find your own piece of heaven as you explore this vast region. We'll ski with local guides for five out of six days. They'll take us to areas with the best conditions and guide us down routes we would never find on our own. And they have lift privileges, so no standing in line for us!

Vallée Blanche, the longest glacial ski run in the world, is a must do. As you quickly climb from 3,379 feet to 12,604 feet on the two-stage Aiguille du Midi cable car, you'll admire the Mont Blanc summit, the Bossons Glacier, the Aiguille Verte and the Drus. The guided descent is over 12 miles long and takes up to six hours, depending on skiing ability, difficulty of route and length of photo stops. The glaciers, peaks and couloirs form a stupendous background to an unforgettable experience.

We will be staying at the four-star, Hotel Le Hameau Albert 1er, situated in a park-like setting near the town center. Built in 1903, it was renamed in 1920 after numerous visits by the King of Belgium. Family-run, the hotel is managed by Martine and Pierre Carrier. After an invigorating day on the slopes, pamper yourself at the massage and beauty center, indoor/outdoor pool, jacuzzi and fitness area. Chef Pierre Carrier's gastronomique restaurant is known as the best in Chamonix. Combined with a wine cellar of more than 20,000 bottles, our dinners are sure to be memorable. We will also enjoy one group dinner at a local restaurant. The other three nights are free for you to sample the regional cuisine. *Please see reverse for room descriptions and indicate your choice on the coupon below.*

By train, **Paris** is less than four hours from Geneva! The Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, Champs Elysees, l'Arc de Triomphe, Notre Dame, shops, cafes, fine dining and more await us. Our hotel, the charming Hotel le Régent, is a former 18th century residence. Its' location in the heart of St. Germain-des-Prés is perfect for exploring the entire city.

Should the group size fall between 10 and 14 people, the package price will increase by \$40. Package prices are subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluations, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of April 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. *All prices reflect a cash or check discount.* For payments by Visa, Mastercard or American Express, add 3%.

EXCHANGE RATE INFORMATION

The U.S. dollar is currently enjoying an extremely favorable exchange rate with the European currencies and the Eurodollar. The pricing of this package reflects the strong value of the dollar. Forecasts indicate that the U.S. dollar will remain strong. However, in the event of a significant drop in the dollar's value, a surcharge will be applied to your package price.

HOTEL ROOM CHOICES — **IMPORTANT!!!!**

All rooms will be assigned on a first come basis. The package price is based on **Superior double rooms** (four available). An upgrade to a **Junior Suite** (four available) costs \$190 extra per person.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENT

Single rooms are limited and available at an extra charge of \$400 (Chamonix Pkg) and \$225 (Paris Extension). Choose from a **Cottage** (two available) or a **Standard double room for single use** (four available). The cottages are small, cozy buildings separate from the main hotel. The standard double rooms are located in the main hotel. Both room types have a private bathroom and a double bed.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Group space in Tourist Class has been booked on SAS for this departure. Departures from other cities or connecting flights are available, usually at a carrier add-on surcharge. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own air arrangements. You are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group in order to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for details. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related reasons.

DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Deviations and extensions are allowed. In addition to any airfare increases/fees and extra land charges, a deviation fee of \$75 will be charged by All Mountain Vacations. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation and extension requests must be submitted prior to **January 10, 2001**. Once deviation itinerary has been confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any additional air and land costs.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations must be received in writing. Cancellation fees of \$400 per person apply prior to Nov. 1, 2000. From Nov. 1-Jan. 24, forfeit all deposits paid unless a replacement can be found. Total land costs plus any airline charges are forfeited from January 25, 2001 to departure. *Trip protection insurance is highly recommended.*

TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel worry-free with Travel Guard Cancellation and Interruption Insurance. For \$197 (Chamonix Pkg) or \$242 (Chamonix Pkg PLUS Paris) per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package that includes the following benefits: full reimbursement of all non-refundable expenses due to cancellation for a medical reason; \$10,000 medical expense; \$20,000 emergency assistance; \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner's risk. It is up to the passenger to make claims with the insurance company. Insurance should be purchased with deposit or final invoice for full value protection. Please be sure that you are adequately covered in case of accident, injury or illness during the trip. **Pre-Existing Medical Conditions Exclusion waived, if policy purchased within seven days of initial trip deposit.** Ask for Travel Guard brochure for complete coverage information.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

U.S. and Canadian citizens require a valid passport. Non-citizens should consult their consulate.

MILEAGE CREDIT

Mileage credit may be earned for your flights. You must be a member prior to departure, and you must submit your mileage account number at check-in.

CARTE NEIGE - FRENCH SKI INSURANCE

In addition to any other kinds of insurance you have, we suggest that you spend about \$2 a day for Carte Neige insurance. It can be purchased at the Tourist Office when you purchase your lift pass and it offers the ultimate in on-mountain coverage and protection. If you are injured on the slopes and need to be evacuated, all of the costs of search and rescue, transportation to the nearest medical facility, reimbursement of lift pass and medical expenses, civil liability against other skiers, breakage of skis and more are covered. If you do not hold Carte Neige, be prepared to pay, in advance, for any services or treatments you require.

TOUR ESCORT

Tour is escorted but not necessarily on all flights. Your escort's primary concern is the welfare of the group. She will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of the group needs.

NOT INCLUDED

Lift passes, meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff, or guides, items of a personal nature, and **Airport Taxes of approximately \$70.00 per person.**

TIPPING

If you have received good service, it is customary to tip porters, bus drivers, guides, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. For planning purposes, average tip costs for the entire trip should be about \$50. Your tour escort will discuss details.
