Our journey begins an arrival into Geneva, Switzerland. A scenic drive along Lac Lemman will bring us to **Montreux**, the city known as the "Pearl of the Swiss Riviera," where we will spend our first night. The breathtaking scenery of vineyards, the lake and the Swiss and French Alps will surround us. The next morning, on our drive to Zermatt, we will stop at **Chateau de Chillon**, a 13th century medieval castle that was the residence of the Counts of Savoy throughout the Middle Ages.

Many skiers argue that **Zermatt** is the finest ski resort in the world. The towering Matterhorn, the absence of cars, and the resort's great sense of tradition give Zermatt a special, alluring atmosphere. Zermatt sits at an elevation of 5,315 feet at the end of a long valley surrounded by three major ski areas with lifts reaching almost 13,000 feet. The entire area is favored by a southern exposure, sheltered from the wind and generously endowed with snow. More than 70 lifts provide access to over 140 miles of superbly groomed runs, with a good blend of beginner, intermediate and advanced terrain as well as over 30 on-mountain restaurants and bars. It is even possible to ski to **Cervinia** in Italy! Non-skiers will enjoy an abundance of possible activities such as horse-drawn sleigh rides, 18 miles of prepared winter walking paths, abundant shopping, helicopter sightseeing tours, ice skating, curling, indoor tennis or just relaxing at one of the many coffee and pastry shops or restaurants. We will be staying at the Hotel Schweizerhof, an elegant four-star hotel situated right in the center of town. This First Class hotel features several restaurants, a bar, indoor pool, fitness room, sauna and steam bath. All guest rooms have balcony, TV, safe, radio, telephone, minibar and hair dryer. After Zermatt, we will return to **Geneva** for a final day of sightseeing and reminiscing about our wonderful holiday. Please join us!

## TOUR DETAILS AND CONDITIONS

### DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENTS

A deposit of \$400 per person is due to hold your place on this tour. Upon receipt of payment, you will be sent an invoice and "Know Before You Go" information kit. Final payment is due **January 25, 2001**. Your place may be cancelled if payments are not received on time.

### PRICING

The package price is based on a minimum group size of 20 participants. Should group size fall between 15 and 19 people, the package price will increase by \$100 per person due to increased transfer costs. Package price is subject to change due to airfare fuel surcharges, currency devaluations, general tariff increases, or for any other reason beyond the control of the tour operators. Tour is priced on exchange rates in effect as of May 1, 2000. Tour price includes reasonable charges for administration and planning of tour. In case of human or computer billing error, All Mountain Vacations reserves the right to reinvoice for the correct amount. *All prices reflect a cash discount.* For payments by Visa, Mastercard or American Express, add 3%.

### EXCHANGE RATE INFORMATION

The U.S. dollar is currently enjoying an extremely favorable exchange rate with the European currencies and the Eurodollar. The pricing of this package reflects the strong value of the dollar. Forecasts indicate that the U.S. dollar will remain strong. However, in the event of a significant drop on the dollar's value, a surcharge will be applied to your package price.

### SINGLE SUPPLEMENT

Single rooms are limited and available on a first-come basis. Add \$175 to package price. Please be aware that single rooms tend to be quite small and may only contain one twin bed.

### DEVIATIONS AND EXTENSIONS

Deviations and extensions are allowed, depending on air space availability. In addition to any airfare increases/fees and extra land charges, a deviation fee of \$75 per person will be charged by All Mountain Vacations. Any unused portions of original package are non-refundable. Deviation and extension requests must be submitted prior to **January 12, 2000**. Once deviation itinerary has been confirmed, any subsequent changes will each be charged a \$35 fee, plus any additional air and land costs.

### CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

All cancellations in writing please. Prior to Sep. 1, 2000, forfeit \$25 per person. From Sep. 1—January 24: forfeit \$400 per person, unless a replacement is found. From January 25 until departure: Forfeit total land costs plus any airline charges unless refunds can be negotiated with hotels and airline.

### TRIP PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel worry-free with Cancellation and Interruption Insurance. For only \$197 per person, you will receive a comprehensive insurance package that includes the following benefits: full reimbursement of all non-refundable payments if trip is cancelled for a medical reason, \$10,000 medical expense, \$20,000 emergency assistance, \$1000 lost baggage allowance, and more. All baggage is carried at owner's own risk. It is up to you to make claims with transportation and insurance companies involved. ### AIR ARRANGEMENTS

Group space in Tourist Class has been booked on SAS for this departure. Departures from other cities or connecting flights are available, usually at a carrier add-on surcharge. Frequent flyer award holders can book their own air arrangements. You are responsible for arriving and departing at the same time as the group in order to use the group transfers. Unused transfers are non-refundable. Upgrades to Business Class are available. Ask for details. Airfares are subject to change by the airline for fuel and tax-related reasons.

### MILEAGE CREDIT

Mileage credit may be earned for your flights. You must be a member before checking in for the flight, and you must submit your mileage account number at check-in.

### SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats are assigned on a first booked and request basis. Carriers will do their best to honor all requests.

### BAGGAGE

Normal baggage allowance is two pieces per person, not to exceed 70 lbs each. A skier on an international flight is allowed to substitute 1 ski bag and 1 boot bag for one of the suitcases, for a total of three pieces of checked luggage. In addition, 1 carry-on bag is allowed, but it cannot exceed 15 lbs. in weight or 45 inches in total dimensions, and it must fit under your seat or in the overhead compartment. To exceed ski baggage allowance could cost approx. \$110 minimum each way per piece.

### TOUR ESCORT

Tour is escorted, but not necessarily on all flights. Your escort's primary concern is the welfare of the group. He will assist in tour-related and individual problems, but not at the expense of group needs.

### PASSPORTS AND VISAS

U.S. and Canadian citizens require a valid passport. Non-citizens please consult your consulate.

### NOT INCLUDED

Lift passes, ski guides, meals not specified, portage at hotels, beverages at meals, tips to porters, drivers, hotel staff or ski guides, items of a personal nature and *& air taxes of approximately \$70 per person.*

### TIPPING

It is customary to tip for good service received from porters, drivers, guides, waitstaff and chambermaids at the end of your stay. Your tour escort will make suggestions and discuss details.
